Student Responsibilities:

- 1. Research using tools provided www.ouac.on.ca or www.ontariocolleges.ca and https://oyap.com/
- 2. Decide which program(s) (and colleges/universities) you wish to apply for. Visiting (virtually or in person) each College/University you are interested in can help you make a more informed decision
- 3. See the attached calendar for some university/college visits offered at St. Joseph's CHS. A number of schools are opting for virtual tours only, these can be accessed through the College or University's direct website.
- 4. **Application workshops for College and University will be held from December 4-8**th **during class time.** Students can start their application with us and complete at home and pay the application fee before the deadline. (either January 15th or February 1^{st)}
- 5. If you are taking any course outside the school including; Night School, Virtual High School, Private or another board's course such as a completed summer school credit you <u>MUST</u> inform Guidance and bring a copy of your midterm and final grade to Ms. Prentice in the Guidance Office so that it will be recorded in your application.
 *In addition if you are taking a private school course it must be completed and reported to us no later than June 15th (this means you have written your final exam and the school has issued you a report card).
- 6. The application for University programs opened at the end of September 2023 however, we recommend you spend time reviewing and researching programs before you begin your application.

Student Services Responsibilities:

- 1. Guidance will process your academic records (including transcript info) and will submit them to the college/university processing centers.
- 2. Update Guidance Google Classroom with updates and information for both post-secondary opportunities and graduation.
- 3. University bound students can obtain their **OEN number** and tips on how to apply from the Guidance Office late in November. It is also located on their report cards.
