<b>College</b>	\$4000- \$6000	\$800-\$1000	\$10,000-\$16,000	\$14,800 - \$23,000

# Finances - Definitions/Information

Type of Financial Support	Program Details
Loans from a Bank	Students can apply for student loans through their bank with parents co-signing.
OSAP - link in application	OSAP applications can be completed at any time and are independent of the school as there is confidential information required. OSAP grants/loans are established once a student has a firm acceptance to a College or University.
Bursaries	Monetary awards based upon academic record and/or financial need
Scholarships including Admission Scholarships	Awards are based on many different/combinations of factors (academic, financial, community involvement, leadership etc.)

- Students can sign up for an application workshop in the Guidance Office in the last week of November. Students will complete the online application at home and pay the application fee before the deadline. (either January 15<sup>th</sup> or February 1<sup>st</sup>)
- If you are taking any course outside of the school including; Night School, Virtual High School or other board courses for example summer school, you **MUST** inform Guidance and bring a copy of your midterm and final grade to Ms. Prentice in the Guidance Office so that it will be recorded in your application.

- Guidance will process your academic records (including transcript info) and will submit them to the college/university processing centers.
- University bound students: Pin numbers will be available in late November (an announcement will be made)

- Guidance will offer **Application online workshops during the week of November 25th**. Students will begin to fill in their applications. Counsellors will review the application process and be available if there are questions.
