<b>University</b>	\$7500-\$18,000 Please ensure you look at each University and program so you are aware of costs	\$800-\$2000	\$11,000-\$17,000 (Varies based on room - single/double and the university)	\$20,000 - \$35,000 (depends on the program and residence you choose)
<b>College</b>	\$4000- \$6000	\$800-\$1000	\$10,000-\$16,000	\$14,800 - \$23,000
<b>OYAP</b>	FREE	\$800-\$1000	6-8 week study period, varies based on type of accommodation	\$1000-\$3000



# Finances - Definitions/Information

Type of Financial Support	Program Details
Loans from a Bank	Students can apply for student loans through their bank with parents co-signing.
OSAP - link in application	OSAP applications can be completed at any time and are independent of the school as there is confidential information required. OSAP grants/loans are established once a student has a firm acceptance to a College or University.
Bursaries	Monetary awards based upon academic record and/or financial need
Scholarships including Admission Scholarships	Awards are based on many different/combinations of factors (academic, financial, community involvement, leadership etc.)

- If you are taking any course outside of the school including; Night School (SCDSB), any private institution you **MUST** inform Guidance and bring a copy of your midterm and final grade to Ms. Prentice in the Guidance Office so that it will be recorded in your application.
